





BALTIMORE, Feb. 12 /PRNewswire-USNewswire/ -- The University of Baltimore has announced the sessions and presenters who will participate in Baltimore '68: Riots and Rebirth, an unprecedented national conference in Baltimore from April 3-5, 2008 on the causes and effects of the 1968 riots.

Baltimore '68: Riots and Rebirth will begin with an Opening Plenary at 6 pm on April 3rd followed by the Maryland Film Premier of Pip and Zastrow. Those submissions were from Baltimore area high school students as well as faculty and students from universities such as Boston, Columbia, Howard, Rutgers, and Virginia Tech, and local institutions including UB, Coppin, Towson, MICA, UMBC, Loyola, Morgan, Johns Hopkins, CCBC, and University of Maryland.

Baltimore '68: Riots and Rebirth is sponsored by UB along with the Maryland Humanities Council, the Annie E. Casey Foundation, WYPR Radio, and Baltimore Collegetown Network.
