BILL OF SALE

The Society of the War of 1812 in Maryland, a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Maryland, in consideration of the acceptance and public display of the Bowie Arms Collection at Fort McHenry National Park, does hereby bargain and sell to the United States of America, the following property:

The Bowie Arms Collection, consisting of antique firearms, now located at Fort McHenry National Park,

Subject to the following express conditions:

1. That the United States of America will maintain in good condition, and display the Bowie Arms Collection in toto at Fort McHenry, unless the Society of the War of 1812 in Maryland approves, under written authorization, the display and maintenance of only a portion of the said collection, in which event the portion of the collection to be displayed and maintained by the United States of America shall be described in the written authorization of the Society.

2. That the said United States of America will mark this display of the Bowie Arms Collection to show that it was a gift of the Society of the War of 1812 in Maryland as follows: "The E. Berkley Bowie Collection of Firearms, presented to Fort McHenry by the Society of the War of 1812 in Maryland", and in a way that is mutually agreeable to the Society of the War of 1812 in Maryland and to the National Park Service; and furthermore that such marking or markings will be permanently maintained by the National Park Service in connection with the display of said collection.

3. That the United States shall not remove the said Bowie Arms Collection, or any portion thereof, from the said Fort McHenry, without written authorization of the Society of the War of 1812 in Maryland. In the event of any unauthorized removal of the said collection in toto or in part, the United States of America shall forthwith surrender possession of the said Bowie Arms Collection to the said Society of the War of 1812 in Maryland, and shall thereby reinvest the Society of the War of 1812 in Maryland with full and absolute title to said collection: Provided, however, that in the event the said collection or a portion thereof is stolen, or without authority of the United States removed, from said Fort McHenry, such removal shall not cause title to the said Collection to reinvest in the Society of the War of 1812 in Maryland, it being understood that the United States of America is responsible only for acts performed by its duly authorized agents acting within the scope of their authority; it also being further understood, that if it becomes known to the United States of America or to the said Society of the War of 1812 in Maryland

that the Bowie Arms Collection or any part thereof has been stolen or removed without authority as hereinabove provided for, from Fort Mifflin, the Secretary of the Interior will recommend to the proper officers of the United States that action legal or otherwise be taken by the United States of America to effect its return, with or without punitive measures, if such action would not result in unreasonable cost being incurred to do so.

Subject: Visit by Mr. Peterson to Fort Mchenry and the Maryland Historical Society

On March 25, Mr. Peterson, of this Division, visited the Maryland Historical Society to examine the swords reputed to have belonged to Colonel Banastre Tarleton and Colonel John Lager Howard to see whether they were pieces that would be appropriate for Guilford Courthouse. The so-called Tarleton sword turned out to be nothing but a 19th century German fencing sword. The Howard sword was a good sword and apparently actually did belong to John Lager Howard. However, it was made considerably after the Revolution and probably was used by Howard during the war of 1812. Thus, we suggest that no further action be taken to borrow these specimens from the Maryland Historical Society.

At the request of Fort Mchenry, Mr. Peterson also visited that area briefly while he was in the city and took a quick survey of the Bowie collection. Mr. Lesson and Mr. Mackenzie have long had misgivings about the accuracy of the labels in this collection, and Mr. Peterson reported that their apprehensions were well founded. In one case, for instance, there was not one correct label and most other cases had several rather bad errors in them. One particularly bad item was a very poorly constructed forgery of a matchlock pistol which at present is a featured specimen. Both Mr. Lesson and Mr. Mackenzie are anxious to rectify this situation as soon as possible, and it is our plan to have Mr. Peterson assist them at his earliest opportunity, perhaps some time in the fall.

Subject: Theft of two pistols from Bowie Arms Collection

When the museum buildings were opened on the morning of September 11, 1951, Millie Barnes, Charwoman, discovered that two pistols of the Bowie Arms Collection had been stolen from their position in one of the wall cases. Apparently someone had fashioned one of the special wrenches required to open the museum cases previously and had returned to open the cases.

The two pistols stolen are described as follows:

178 - Percussion Pepper-box, Caliber .32, 6 shots
Stamped on top of hammer "Allen's Patent" on side
of hammer "Allen and Thurber, Grafton, Mass."
Approximate value, \$36.00

284 - Rim-Fire Revolver, Caliber .32, Six Shots
This revolver was invented by Frank P. Slocum of
Brooklyn, N. Y. Its chief peculiarity is a number of
independent movable chambers. These are admitted in re-
cesses in a revolving cylinder and are slipped forward
against a stationary piston rod to retract the exploded
cartridge case. Patented April 14, 1863. Value: \$30.00.

I immediately notified the F.B.I. and asked for investigation and steps were taken to exclude visitors from that case in order that we might get copies of any finger prints appearing on the glass.



Messrs. Lord and Sullivan of the F.B.I. responded to the call. They made an investigation of the premises and the circumstances of the theft and were furnished the above descriptions of the missing items.

No further word has been received from the F.B.I.

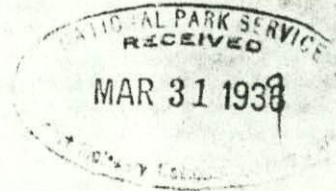

Dear Mr. Palmer:

Attached hereto is an appraisal of the value of the items contained in the Bowie Collection as requested by you in your letter of January 8 to Mr. Sachse.

In making this appraisal Mr. Sachse has used data collected over a period of years from prices paid at auctions, asked in dealers catalogs and his own judgement based upon association with collectors. In his opinion the prices given are those which the items would bring if they were placed upon the market today.

The value of firearms as of other types of antiques depends of course upon many factors. However, the prime factor is the number of items available for purchase by collectors. Whenever a large and important collection is donated to a museum there are proportionately fewer items available on the market, and the number of collectors is constantly increasing. For these reasons it is certain that the Bowie Collection will increase in value as the years go by. Mr. Sachse states that an appraisal ten years from now would be almost double that which has been put upon the collection at the present time.

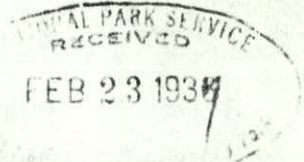

My dear Senator:-

It is my understanding that Mr. James B. Hanceck, of Baltimore, Maryland, President of the Society of the War of 1812, contemplates writing (or perhaps has already written) to you in connection with the collection of firearms of my brother, the late E. Berkley Bowie, which collection has been established at Fort McHenry, Baltimore, since September 1934, with the object of raising some question of title to this collection as between his Society and the Fort McHenry National Park.

In a nutshell the situation is that I, as administrator of my brother's estate, arranged with Mr. Hanceck that his Society should act as a "straw man" in effecting the presentation of this collection to the United States Government for installation as a permanent exhibit at Fort McHenry, the consideration moving this arrangement being that I would have the benefit of the Society's prestige in persuading the Government to accept the presentation of the collection and, on the other hand, the Society would receive the credit of being the author of the gift. The Government very promptly accepted this offer and, as it was necessary for it to expend several thousand dollars on constructing show cases, etc., it naturally could not accept the collection on any other terms than as a gift to it, subject to reversion to the true owner in case at any future time the collection, or any part thereof, should be removed from exhibit at Fort McHenry. This arrangement was perfected and I have every reason to be satisfied with the manner in which the Fort McHenry National Park officials have cared for and organized the display of these firearms.

I am frank to say that I am at a complete loss to comprehend any valid ground for protest or complaint which Mr. Hanceck imagines he has, since the installation at Fort McHenry has been carried out as contemplated and the Society enjoys the full credit for the presentation. I think I may go so far as to say that I have been informed that Mr. Hanceck does not represent the consensus of opinion of the Society in this matter. Be that as it may, I regret very much that your most valuable time should in any way be invaded by this "insect in a teapot" of minute proportions, but I thought that perhaps you would be interested in having at hand some additional light on Mr. Hanceck's complaint.



N O T E

Recognition of Mr. Bowie's generosity in donating his collection of firearms to the Fort Mifflin National Park Museum should be accorded by means of a suitable plaque to be prepared at the Museum Division Laboratory and exhibited in a suitable location in one of the museum rooms.

The remaining items in the E. Berkley Bowie Collection of Firearms not used in the museum exhibit are to be housed in the two rooms above the gun museum in a study collection, where they will be properly preserved and be available to specialists who desire to carry further their interests in the technical characteristics of firearms.

Until such time as funds are available for the purchase of standard museum cases, it is recommended that wooden cases be constructed to house the study collection.

Of the swords contained in the Bowie Collection, a selection representative of successive periods of American history should be exhibited in exhibit cases in the study collection rooms.

Such a collection of metallic objects as the Bowie Collection in a museum located adjacent to a body of water requires special work on the part of its curators and other officers of the Museum Division skilled in the technics of preserving museum specimens of this character. This is true not only in regard to the study collection but to the exhibits

at Fort McHenry, in spite of the fact that they are preserved in
museum cases. "Provision of personnel and funds for the periodic
inspection and cleaning of the many valuable specimens in this
collection will be required since the Park Service has assumed
an essential obligation with acceptance of this collection."

Subject: Loan - Bowie Collection

I am directing and managing the renovation of the Civil War museum at Gettysburg National Military Park. It is wonderful that you and the Society of the War of 1812 in the State of Maryland have consented to exhibit part of the Bowie Collection at Gettysburg. With this material added to the large collection already at Gettysburg, we believe it will be one of the top two or three Civil War weapon exhibits in the nation, and it will be seen by the 800,000 visitors who go to the museum each year.

There is only one condition of the loan proposed by the Society that is a problem. It is their proposal for credit identification on the exhibit. We are happy to give credit but would like to do it in a slightly different format in order to have uniformity throughout the museum. We have many lending institutions supporting the museum project at Gettysburg and all of them have agreed to our format of recognition. I would not like to have to change this format or make an exception. Currently we have an institution lenders' plaque conspicuously exhibited in the museum that says:

"The following institutions have part of their
Civil War collections on display in this museum."

This is followed by the name of each institution, the city and state where it is located, and a code consisting of its initials. At the bottom of the plaque it says:

"Artifacts from these institutions are identified
on the exhibit labels with the initials shown
above."

Dear Mr. Rittenhouse:

We have received a request from John Earnst, the superintendent of Gettysburg National Military Park, to borrow, on a long-term loan, 25 weapons from our museum collection to be used in a new permanent exhibit. The weapons he has asked to borrow are part of the Bowie Gun Collection and are currently in storage in the Civil War Powder Magazine as part of our study collection. We have no plans to use them in any exhibit here. Gettysburg's museum collection does not contain these weapons, and so they have turned to us for help.

We would like to be able to loan Gettysburg these weapons. In March 1981 the Society modified the provisions of the gift transferring the Bowie Gun Collection to the National Park Service. This allows us to loan weapons to other NPS sites under certain conditions for a period of one year. We would like to ask the Society to waive the condition limiting the term of the loan to one year and allow us to make this a long-term loan for the life of the exhibit.


As you know, designing, constructing and installing new exhibits is an expensive process. For the weapons to only be installed for one year, or even three or four, would not be economical and would require construction of new exhibits.

If granting Gettysburg a loan for the life of the exhibit is not acceptable, I am sure that Superintendent Earnst would not mind renewing the loan annually in the form of a memorandum to the superintendent of Fort McHenry, with the assurance that the weapons will be returned to us when the exhibit is no longer needed. While on exhibit, the weapons will be identified as "From the E. Berkley Bowie Collection of Firearms presented to Fort McHenry, by the Society of the War of 1812 in Maryland."

I can assure you too, that the staff at Gettysburg will take satisfactory care of these valuable objects and will take every precaution to prevent theft or other loss. Before they go on exhibit, each weapon will be inspected and those that require it will be given conservation treatment to preserve them. Once on display they will be inventoried annually and checked regularly for signs of deterioration. In all likelihood, they will receive better treatment by being on exhibit than they would while they are in storage.

I have enclosed a list of the handguns, muskets and swords and scabbards Gettysburg has requested. I would appreciate any consideration you can give to our request, and hope that you will allow us to loan them these weapons for the length of time needed at Gettysburg. Thank you.

Our Proposal is as follows:

Conservation Treatment of Bowie Gun Collection

All handling of weapons will be done in a workmanlike manner as one would expect from a professional gunsmith, and treated with the care required from a museum conservator.

The utmost care will be taken to preserve all of the original qualities of each piece. Initial assesment will be made of the condition of each piece upon receipt and written description made of said condition. At the conclusion an additional notation of work and materials used will be listed.

Each piece will be completely disassembled, cleaned, and treated for preservation. At this time, no repairs or restoration were asked for, nor will any be made unless specifically requested. Price quotation can be provided for any such item.

In general terms, the original finish will not be altered however, old varnish or caked on grease and dirt will be removed with solvent. No sandpaper, emory cloth or file will be used on any weapon. During disassembly, each screw will be approached on an individual basis, where necessary, the blade of the screwdriver to be used will be ground to fit that particular screw.

Equipment and chemicals to be used are: Hoppe's No.9 Solvent, Hoppe's Gun Oil, Renaissance wax, flannel patches and rags, Q-tips, toothbrushes and other soft brushes.

All weapons while in my possession will be fully insured to the present value placed on them by the NPS. If covered by the NPS, this will not be done.


This proposal is for the entire collection of 116 firearms. Payment will be made upon receipt and approval of each group worked on. Payment terms will be net 30 for each group returned. The

entire project, once contracted for, will entail a maximum of three and one half (3½) months time for completion. The cost for all conservation, labor, materials, and transportation will be \$3,155.00. If we must insure the collection, this price will be an additional line item based on actual cost. If photographic coverage is required, a competent individual is available and the fee will be quoted upon request.



Re: Condition of Bowie Gun Collection

During the last week of February thru the early weeks of March I worked with Paul Plamman in the yearly inventory of the Bowie Gun Collection. At that time I took the opportunity of inspecting each and every piece of the collection to determine its condition. The following information is a result of that inspection.

In order to clarify the condition and better describe the problems of the collection a system of classification was developed. This classification pertains only to the curatorial condition of the object and in no way corresponds to the physical condition of the object as outlined by the N.R.A. classification system. The objective of the classification was simply to allow us to identify and prioritize those items needing conservation work. The classification is in four degrees as follows;

Very Good Condition Object is in a stable condition and will not require conservation in the near future if properly stored and handled.

Good Condition Object is presently in a stable condition requiring no conservation work, but should be closely monitored for signs of deterioration.

Poor Condition Object is in an unstable condition and has the potential for rapid deterioration. In this collection the vast majority of objects in this category were so described due to heavy deposits and concentration of cosmoline.

Immediate Conservation Object is in a very unstable condition and is rapidly deteriorating. This includes active rusting which was visible on many of the objects. Loaded weapons, due to the safety hazard, were also included in this category.

Statistics

It was found by the investigation that of the 540 some objects examined in the collection the condition statistically broke down as follows;

Vey Good Condition	57 objects	10.55%
Good Condition	136 objects	25.18%
Poor Condition	157 objects	29.07%
Immediate Conservation	190 objects	35.18%

As can be seen, the collection is in need of immediate attention.



Priorities

Bearing in mind that the collection is currently funded to the amount of \$6,000 for cyclic maintenance conservation needs, I would like to suggest the following priorities. It is doubtful that the 35% of the collection needing work can be reached with so little funding, however it is hoped that the most immediate problems can be addressed.

1. The most rapid deterioration seen in the collection was evident in the bayonets stored in locker K1. Unfortunately the bayonets have been stored in a horizontal position on a cloth shelf liner. The material has retained enough moisture that any of the bayonet surface in contact with the material has developed severe rust. The active rust on these items should be the first priority. The objects are as follows;

2. The second priority should be the group of weapons returned to the collection from HFC. Upon arrival the weapons were stored in plastic bags, and remained in these bags on the recommendation of HFC personnel. Unfortunately there was not enough air circulation in the bags resulting in the barrels developing active rust in a very short time. These objects are as follows;

3. The examination of the collection revealed that a number of muzzle loading weapons are in fact still loaded. In the case of some of the weapons it was difficult to determine if loaded or not due to heavy deposits of rockhard cosmoline deposited in the breech area. All weapons suspected of being loaded should be sent to Museum Services for reasons of safety. The weapons suspected of being loaded are as follows.

4. The remaining objects in need of immediate conservation provide such a variety of work that it is difficult to develop priorities. It is suggested that they simply be taken in numerical order and the work continued until the funds are exhausted.

Recomendations

In order to maintain a stable condition through out the following recommendations are suggested for the maintenance of the collection.

1. There is an imperative need to clean the entire Museum Storage Area. The present accumulation of dust, dirt, and mice feces can only lead to continued storage problems and bug infestation.


2. The cloth material which presently lines the shelves is collecting moisture and should be replaced. Thin sheets of foam padding are available from Museum Services. I am in the process of drawing designs for a rack which may be easily added to the cabinets and will I hope, result in a better storage arrangement.

3. The doors of the weapons lockers should have a four inch square cut in the door at eye level. This will allow air to circulate freely in and around the weapons. Without the holes the closed doors tend to create a mini environment which results in higher humidity levels. The holes should be covered with fine screen or cheese cloth to avoid insect penetration of the cases.

4. The heating unit currently placed on the floor along the right rear wall should be remounted above the level of the cases. The present location allows the hot air to blow directly on the cabinet and thus creates great fluctuations in heat and humidity.

5. The table currently used as a study area should have a simple frame and paneling wall erected around it . This will allow professionals to enter and view portions of the collection without sacrificing security of the Museum Storage Area. With the renewed interest in the collection by members of the Maryland Arms Collectors Association, and the 1983 meeting of the Company of Military Historians being held in Baltimore, it is certain that the number of requests to view the collection will increase.

I respectfully submit these comments to you for your review, and would like to discuss the collection with you at your earliest possible convenience.



Please find enclosed the information necessary to begin the bidding for the conservation work on the Bowie Gun Collection. You are reminded that this list includes only those weapons which were identified as being in bad condition in the spring inventory. As I understand the situation those weapons that were identified as needing immediate conservation will be treated by Harpers Ferry Center. It is hoped that this work can be done as soon as possible. The conclusion of the HFC work and this contractual work should put the entire collection in a condition of which we all can be proud.

Specifications: Each weapon will be dismantled, inspected, and all traces of cosmoline, old wax, dirt, and rust will be removed from interior and exterior surfaces. All metal surfaces, interior and exterior, will be treated with micro-crystalline wax. All wood stocks and grips will be treated on a as needed basis, with applications of Butchers Wax. The weapons will be reassembled. The weapons will be issued to the contractor in allotments of no more than a dozen (12) at a time, and will be transported by the contractor at their own expense. Prior to the removal of the first allotment, the contractor will show proof of fine arts insurance coverage on the work place.
