Dear Mr. Barnes:

We have received a request from Gettysburg National Military Park for the loan of additional weapons from the Bowie Collection for display and use by the Gettysburg Museum of the Civil War. Their request involves two uses for the items: (1) items which will be on display in the museum; and (2) items that will be in their study collection which will be available to scholars and others doing research. The conditions for access to the study collection will be strictly controlled to maintain the security of the collection.

I must admit that I have mixed feelings about their request. First, I am somewhat reluctant to have this part of the collection leave Fort McHenry. It was donated to Fort McHenry and moving part of the collection to Gettysburg was not the intent at the time of the donation. However, we do not have the space at this time or plan to build the space that would allow the display of the collection at Fort McHenry. For the foreseeable future, the collection will remain in storage. Because of staff limitations, we are unable to allow study of the collection, except in very special cases with advance arrangements.

Because of the above limitations, I recommend that the Society of the War of 1812 approve of the loan to Gettysburg. This will allow the many visitors to Gettysburg to enjoy and appreciate the collection. The arrangements for the study collection items will allow more scholars to study the collection and learn from it. The Society will be receiving credit for its role in making the collection available for display and study.

Since this is the 125th Anniversary of Gettysburg, the staff there is anxious to have the exhibits in place for the majority of the summer season. I have enclosed a copy of the list of items they would like on loan. If you or any of the Board Members have questions about this, please let me know.

money for maintenance and general operation, but more is needed. We ask more awareness and help from the private sector. This is the only national monument that is also an historic shrine," he said.

"The War of 1812 is the Korean War of the 19th century — a forgotten war. But it enabled us to keep the freedom we won 30 years earlier in the Revolution, and it gave us our National Anthem," said Mr. Walden, a history buff.

Robert N. Ford, Maryland Legion adjutant, said yesterday's contributions came from 20 of the state's 168 Legion posts, "and we'll hit the rest, too."

During a tour, Superintendent Tyler said the outer fortification walls have suffered the most damage because they were built without foundations or a drainage system. The buildings and walls of the inner fort are in "pretty good shape," although some window frames, floor joists and other wooden parts will be repaired or replaced.

The damage to the bastion walls has been cumulative over decades, mainly for lack of drainage, Mr. Tyler said. When water built up in the earthen-fill areas between the brick and stone facings it froze and thawed, contracting and expanding in relentless pressure on the walls.

Chinks have appeared where ce-

ment has been forced out, bricks have split and sections of brickwork have fallen out; a sightline down some walls reveals how they have buckled.

Fort McHenry was begun in 1797 and was modified periodically through the Civil War. "In doing archaeology and reviewing documents, we have found no hint of a drainage system," Mr. Tyler said.

A survey by the Baltimore architectural firm of Grieves, Worrall, Wright & O'Hatnick is nearly complete and will recommend what needs to be done and how it should be done, Mr. Tyler said.

Once the restoration plans are firm, he said, contracts for the work will be drafted and put out for bid. While modern restoration techniques and materials may be used, the objective will be accuracy, Mr. Tyler said. For example, the Park Service will go to brick manufacturers to obtain bricks that match as nearly as possible the existing masonry.

Fort McHenry's walls are finally breached

Time, winter ice do what British couldn't

Time has done what British rockets and cannon shells couldn't do, breached the ramparts at Fort McHenry.

In the visitors center yesterday, the film about the American resistance to the bombardment in 1814 ended with "The Star-Spangled Banner" as the curtains retracted to reveal the 17-by-25-foot, 15-star-15-stripe battle flag streaming above the red-brick walls.

Closer inspection, however, reveals where bricks have cracked and fallen out, and walls have buckled. Water leaks have weakened the curved brick ceilings of underground Civil War-era powder magazines. Floor joists and window frames are rotting in some places.

But all is not lost, said Park Superintendent John W. Tyler.

Congress has approved a special \$3 million appropriation for a three-year restoration, which is scheduled to begin this summer, Mr. Tyler said.

He said it will be the most extensive repair since the Army renovated the fort before turning it over to the National Park Service in the 1930s.

The appropriation will meet only part of the need, however.

In a ceremony at the fort yesterday, Maryland American Legion posts donated \$14,700 to the Patriots of Fort McHenry, a volunteer organization established in 1984 for the preservation and enhancement of the fort through patriotic and educational programs.

"It's a phenomenal site, probably the most historic place in the country. Volunteer organizations and the government have to get behind the preservation," said Dominic DiFrancesco, of Middletown, Pa., American Legion national commander. "We [the Legion] want to expand our own effort."

The Patriots group has raised \$250,000 so far, said Alan Walden, of WBAL Radio, who is the current president. But he lamented what he said is "very little support from the city and very little corporate support."

He also criticized the House of Delegates for twice failing to go along with the state Senate in passing a bill for state funds — \$250,000 — to match what the Patriots have raised.

"A perception exists that because this is a federal institution the federal government should pay for everything. The Park Service provides

HE DONATED HIS COLLECTION TO THE MARYLAND SOCIETY OF THE WAR OF 1812. IN 1935 THE THE SOCIETY OF THE WAR OF 1812 IN MARYLAND PLACED THE COLLECTION IN THE CARE OF THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE AT FT. MCHENRY NATIONAL MONUMENT AT BALTIMORE, MARYLAND. SUBSEQUENTLY THE COLLECTION WAS DONATED TO THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE AND [PARTS] MOVED TO GETTYSBURG BATTLEFIELD FOR CARE, STUDY AND DISPLAY."

Approximately two hundred shoulder, side and edged arms are maintained in dust-proof, climate-controlled plate glass enclosures in three galleries with concealed spotlighting and carpeted aisles approximately twelve feet wide. The pieces are displayed no closer one to another than twelve inches.

Each component is identified, described and provenanced in military terminology on a laminated six by eight inch plaque.



portions the Annual Controlled Inventory Report pertaining to the Collection for which GETT is responsible. Copies of reports of incidents of theft, loss or damage related to the Collection will be provided to FOMC and The Society within ten (10) working days of occurrence.

(10) Renewal of the loan triennially to be generated by GETT and sent to FOMC to the attention of the Superintendent.

(11) Any alterations to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by the parties hereto.

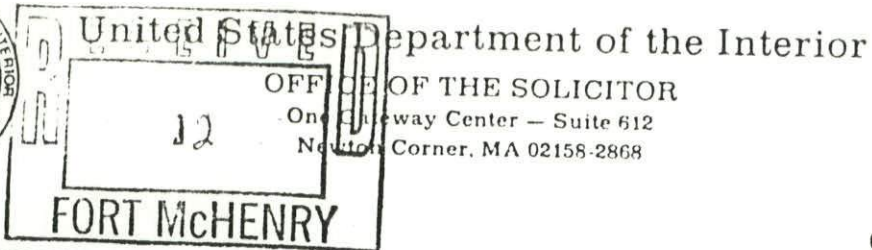

As per your request I have reviewed the above-captioned instrument and have the following comments:

1. Units of the National Park System are not legal entities. Therefore, the MOU should be between the U.S. Department of the Interior, National Park Service and the Society. Please note the proper form is to put the USDO I before NPS. Also, there should be a recital of the status of the Society, i.e., a non-profit corporation, etc., which is not reflected in the draft. Finally, the reference to "a unit of the National Park System" in the first paragraph is inappropriate unless placed after Ft. McHenry NM & HS. Accordingly, said paragraph should read:

This agreement entered into by and between The Society of the War of 1812 in Maryland [if appropriate add Inc. or Corp., a non-profit corporation incorporated under the laws of the State of Maryland or an unincorporated association, etc.] (hereinafter Society), acting by and through the President of the Society, and the United States Department of the Interior, National Park Service (hereinafter Service), acting by and through the Superintendent, Ft. McHenry National Monument and Historic Shrine (hereinafter Park).

2. Second paragraph - Delete words "National Park" and capital T in "the"; delete words "United States Department of the Interior".
3. Third paragraph - It is generally preferable to cite to the U.S. Code rather than the Statutes at Large so 43 Stat. 1109 should become 16 U.S.C. §§ 437-440a.
4. Sixth paragraph - typo - duplicate line "Department of ...". However, this quote seems inappropriate since the NPS is receiving a loan from the Society rather than loan it anything. Cite language from 16 U.S.C. § 18f(d) instead of § 18f(e). However, if the NPS, in fact, owns the collection, the existing language would be appropriate.
5. I don't have the attachment referenced in Article II, but normally if an item is sold the new owner doesn't need permission

from the previous owner to move the item. I assume this "Bill of Sale" includes some conditions which require the NPS to seek the permission of the Society before moving the collection. **If the "sale" does not include such "conditions", there is no reason to enter into such an MOU.** Article II (2) - Abbreviations should be kept consistent so "FOMC" should be changed to "Service". In Article II (4) I assume the said collection was sold or given to the NPS or DOI since the park unit is not a legal entity so "Park" should probably be changed to "Service". In Article II (5) why is the NPS accounting to the Society if it owns the collection?

6. Article IV does not read logically. I think what is probably meant is that the MOU is subject to the laws and regulations governing the NPS.

7. Add standard Anti-Deficiency Act clause.

8. Last paragraph contains a typo - "action" should be "acting".



Memorandum of Understanding

Between

U.S. Department of Interior, National Park Service
Fort McHenry National Monument and Historic Shrine

and

The Society of the War of 1812 in Maryland

Article I
Background and Objectives

This agreement entered into by and between The Society of the War of 1812 in Maryland, a non-profit corporation incorporated under the laws of the State of Maryland (hereinafter Society), acting by and through the President of the Society, and the United States Department of the Interior, National Park Service (hereafter Service), acting by and through the Superintendent, Fort McHenry National Monument and Historic Shrine (hereinafter Park) for the purpose of insuring appropriate display, storage and maintenance of the E. Berkley Bowie Collection of Firearms (hereinafter Collection) within structures of the Park and other units of the National Park System, United States Department of the Interior; and

Whereas, The Service administers the Park and other areas that were established as units of The Service pursuant to 16 U.S.C. 437-440a; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the National Park Service (or his delegate) pursuant to 16 U.S.C. 1a-1 is required to authorize only those uses within the Park(s) that will not be a derogation of the values and purposes for which the Park(s) were established, except as may have been or shall be directly and specifically provided by Congress; and

WHEREAS, the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, pursuant to 16 U.S.C. 6 is authorized to accept lands, buildings and other property and monies which may be donated for the purpose of the national park and monument system; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 16 U.S.C. 18f-(e), the Secretary of the Department of the Interior is authorized to loan to responsible public or private organizations, institutions or agencies, such museum objects, museum collections, and other personal property as he shall consider advisable, such loans to be made upon terms and conditions which he shall consider necessary to protect the public interest in such properties; and

WHEREAS, The Society agrees in principle to permit the Park to loan or exhibit at National Park areas outside of the Park, items, parcels, or portions of The E. Berkley Bowie Firearms Collection.

NOW, THEREFORE, the two parties do mutually understand and agree as follows:

Article II
Statement of Work

The Memorandum of Understanding herein made is subject to the following terms and conditions:

(1) Pursuant to the conditions outlined in the Bill of Sale of February 21, 1938 (see attachment A) the E. Berkley Bowie Firearms Collection, in sum or in part, may be removed from the Park with prior written permission of the Society.

(2) Certain items of the collection (see attachment B) will be loaned by the Park utilizing forms and procedures authorized by the Service for this purpose.

(3) Certain items in the collection may be placed in secure storage, in facilities designed for this purpose, if in the judgement of the Superintendent it is necessary and prudent in order to maintain appropriate historical display or maintenance and the encouragement of scholarship.

(4) Displays containing loaned items will be identified as being from the E. Berkley Bowie Collection of Firearms presented to Ft. McHenry by the Society of the War of 1812 in Maryland.

(5) Copies of an inventory report specific to elements of the Bowie Collection on loan to other institutions, will be provided to the Society by the Park on an annual basis (see attachment C). Copies of reports of incidents of theft, loss or damage related to the Collection will be provided to The Society within fifteen (15) working days of occurrence.

(6) Any alterations to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by the parties hereto.

Article III Term of Agreement

The Memorandum of Understanding hereby made shall terminate five (5) years from the effective date hereof, at noon, Maryland time, unless prior thereto it is relinquished, abandoned, or otherwise terminated pursuant to the provisions of this Agreement or of any applicable Federal law or regulation. In addition, the Agreement will expire at the end of the specified term unless formally reaffirmed or rewritten if necessary. The effective date of this Agreement shall be the date of its execution by the Director (or his delegate).

Unless relinquished, abandoned, or otherwise terminated pursuant to the provisions of the Agreement or of any applicable Federal law or regulations, the Agreement will be considered for renewal.

It is the expressed intent of The Service and The Society that this agreement be renewed in perpetuity.

Article IV Key Officials

This Memorandum of Understanding is subject to the laws and regulations governing the National Park Service. The Superintendents or their representatives shall comply with the regulations of the Secretary of the interior and other applicable conditions outlined herein:



All obligations of the National Park Service hereunder are subject to the availability of funds, and to such direction and instructions as may have been or are hereafter provided by Congress.


