Some Graves of Veterans War 1812-1814, and Some Epitaphs at Old Glendy Burial Grounds, Broadway, Biddle and Chase Streets.

The oldest tombstone remaining (among the noted) bears date January 14, 1803.

Among the inscriptions are the following. Those marked with Red **X** were participants in War 1812.

1. In Memory of DAVID ARMOUR, a Native of Ayrshire, North Briton, But for more than twenty Years A Resident of this City, who departed this life on 11th day of November, 1810, Aged forty-two years; the character of this valuable Citizen was stamped with Benevolence, probity And Integrity.

2. In memory of Jane, the wife of James Armstrong, who departed this life on the 6th of December, 1816, Aged 52 years. Also in memory of James Armstrong, her Husband, who departed this life on the 5th of Jan'ry, 1823, aged 68 years. He was an affectionate Husband, tender parent, good neighbor, respectable Merchant and an honest man.

3. In memory of SARAH BANKSTON, Oct. 26, 1759, May 3, 1836.

4. Here lies the body of WILLIAM BARKSDALE, Born in Charlotte County, Virginia, March, 1752, Died in the City of Baltimore, October, 1828. The Benevolence of his Heart Was without a parallel, The Solidity of his Judgment has rarely been exceeded. The Generosity of his Character Never surpassed. He died as he had lived, Possessed of the esteem Of all who knew him.

5. To the memory of SAMUEL BIGGARTHE, who died in 1820, Aged 54 years; Also Margaret, his wife, November 7, 1844, Aged 68, Natives of county Antrim, Ireland.

6. In memory of COLONEL JERU BOULDIN, who departed this life May the 5th, 1830, in the 70th year of his age.

7. In memory of Grace, wife of William Camp, who departed this life on the 9th of Decr., 1814, Aged 35 years and 11 months. Lo, where this silent marble weeps, A friend, a wife, a mother sleeps; A heart within those sacred cell The peaceful virtues loved to dwell; Affection warm and faith sincere, And warm humanity were there; In agony, in death, resigned, She felt the wound she left behind.

8. In Memory of Hans Creevey, who departed this life on the 1st November, 1820. He was long a respectable Merchant of this City, Aged 75 years.

9. In Memory of JOHN CROSS, a native of Clones, Ireland, and 35 years a citizen of America. He departed this life the 29th of Sept., 1807, Aged 77 years. Also in memory of Jane Cross, Consort of John Cross, who departed this life March 6th, 1826, Aged 85 years. A native of Guardhill, County Monaghan, Ireland.

10. In Memory of Elizabeth, the wife of JAMES DAVIDSON, who departed this life June 20, 1808, Aged 49 years. A native of Ireland, County Antrim, leaving A Husband and 6 Children to Lament her Loss.

11. Sacred to the memory of THOMAS DIXON, Esquire, Who departed this life July the 8th, 1810, Aged 52 years.

12. In Memory of ROBERT DUNWOODYES, who departed this life May the 8th, 1824, In the 67th year of his Age.

13. In Memory of WM. ESPEY, A Native of Ireland, departed this life Septr. 18th, 1824, Aged 33 Yrs. Weep not dear friends as you pass by, For in this grave here I must lie, And here my body must remain Till Christ shall call me forth again.

14. In Memory of ANN FLETCHER, wife of Peter Fendy, who departed this life March 10th, 1809, In the 47th year of her Age. Mercy, good Lord, mercy I ask, This is the total sum, For mercy, Lord, is all my suit, Lord, let thy mercy come.

15. PETER FENBY SR., a native of Yorkshire, England. Died January 27, 1827, aged 71 years.

16. Sacred to the Memory of James Ferguson, Stone Cutter, a native of Newtonlimnavady, County of Londonderry, Ireland, who departed this life Novr., 26th, 1821, Aged 32 years and 8 months. James be thy worth remembered by the just And by thy frailties buried in the dust, A wife this verse bestows by honour led, Who Lov'd thee living and laments thee dead.

17. To the memory of JAMES FULTON, who departed this life on the 8th day of February 1824, in the 49th year of his age. This Stone was erected by his affectionate relict, Mary Neilson Fulton.

18. Here lies the body of JOHN GAFF, Cabinet Maker, a Native of Scotland, who departed this life on the 13th Septr., 1811, in the forty-fifth Year of his Age. Stop passenger and drop a tear O'er the lamented frame that moulders here.

19. In Memory of MRS. MARTHA GARRETT, wife of Robert Garrett, who departed this life 2nd October, 1812, in the 21st year of her age.

20. Sacred to the memory of CHARLES HAMEL, who departed this life April 19th, 1823, in the 42nd year of his Age. Sickness soir long time he bore, Physicians' Skill in vain, till God relieved his tender case And took away the pain.

21. In memory of ALEXANDER B. HANNA, who departed this life Decr. 10, 1827, Aged 73 Years.

22. Sacred to the memory of ANDREW HANNA, a native of Ireland, who departed this life March 26th, 1814, aged 38 years.

23. In memory of JOHN HANNA, Sen., Died Dec'r. 7, 1829, Aged 52 years.

24. In Memory of SAMUEL HARPER, Who departed this life July the 23d, 1808, Aged 58 years.

25. In Memory of SUSANNAH, Wife of ROBERT HERRON, who departed this life Janry. 14th, 1803, Aged 29 Years.

26. In Memory of Capt. WILLIAM HULL, Who departed this life May 30th, 1810, Aged 39 Years. The sweet remembrance of the just Shall flourish when he sleeps in dust.

27. In Memory of JOHN K. KANE, Born Nov. 25th 1804, Died Dec. 30th, 1840.

X 28. In memory of CAPT. JOHN KENNEDY, a native of Ireland, who emigrated to this his adopted country in early manhood, and at the Battle of North Point, on the 12th of September, 1814, he was Commander of the 2nd Company in the 27th Regiment, M.M. and for his gallant and Soldierly conduct in that action he received the approbation of his superior officers. He was born in Monaghan and died in this City on the 10th of December, 1822, in the 57th year of his age.

29: RUSSELL KILBOURN, Departed this life February 16th, 1823, Aged 53 Years, 8 months and 21 days. Forgive blest shade the tributary tear That mourns thy exit from a world like this: Forgive the wish that would have kept thee here And stay'd thy progress to the seats of bliss. No more confin'd to groveling scenes of night; No more a tenant pent in mortal clay. Now should we rather hail thy glorious flight And trace thy journey to the realm of day.

30. In Memory of ROBERT KITHCART, Died Septr. 24th, 1814, AE.28.

31. In memory of DAVID KNOX, a native of County Antrim Ireland, who departed this life Sept. 2nd, A.D. 1826, Aged 47 years.

X 32. Sacred to the Memory of COL. KENNEDY LONG, who departed this life the 27th Feby., 1824, in the 58 Year of his Age.

33. In memory of WILLIAM LORMAN, who departed this Life January 8th, 1832, aged 45. Likewise of Jacob King, a native of County Derry, Ireland, who died 25th July, 1838, aged 33 years.

34. In Memory of DAVID McADAMS, who departed this life Augt. 10th, 1811, Aged 37 years.

35. In Memory of JOHN McCAFFER, who departed this life 2nd of January, 1818, after a lingering illness, which he bore with Christian fortitude. A native of Ireland and Citizen of Baltimore 18 years. Aged 55 years.

36. In memory of RICHARD A. McCLEARY, who departed this life July the 5th, 1809, aged 18 months. My parents dear, weep not for me When in this yard my grave you see; My time was short, and blest is he Who called me to Eternity.

37. In Memory of THOMAS McELDERRY, a Native of Ireland, Born May 14th, 1758, in Antrim County, who departed this life May 28th, 1810, Aged Fifty-two years and fourteen days.

38. In memory of ELIZABETH McELDERRY, Consort of the late Thomas McElderry; departed this life the 20th October 1819, Aged 49 years and 26 days.

39. Sacred to the Memory of WILLIAM McINTIRE, a Native of the County of Antrim, Ireland, who departed this life December 11th, 1810, In the 27th Year of his Age. Adieu vain World, I've had enough of thee, And now am careless what thou say't of me. Thy smiles I court not, nor thy frowns do fear. My cares are past, and I rest quiet here. The faults you saw in me take care to shun, And look at home, enough is to be done.

40. Sacred to the memory of MARY MCKELDIN, who died January 31st, 1818, in the 67th year of her age.

41. In memory of SAMUEL McKIM, who was for many years a highly respected citizen and merchant of Baltimore. He

was born in the state of Delaware on 9th of May 1768, and departed this life on the 1st Octr., 1824.

~~X~~ 42. Sacred To the memory of JAS. McNeal Jr., A native of Ireland, who departed this life Dec. 22nd, 1831, in the 45th year of his age. Also ELIZABETH McNEAL, his wife, who departed this life Octr. 5th, 1831, In the 48th year of her age, A native of Baltimore County, Md.

Lament not o'er departed worth, Nor weep when dearest friends are blest; When their frail body's in the earth Their souls are in eternal rest. At death's cold hand we need not sigh, But to our maker turn our care; That we in future may on high, Among the saints in heaven appear. The sacred paths of truth they trod; Death snatch'd them home to meet their God, Eternal joys through Christ to share, God grant we may all meet them there.

X 43. In memory of GEO. W. MILLER, One of the gallant band of Patriots under Major Armistead, who repelled the enemy from Fort McHenry, Sept. 12th, 1814. Born Apl. 14th 1777, died Feby. 24th, 1836.

44. In Memory of RUTH MISKIMON, wife of Samuel Miskimon who departed this life The 12th day of December, 1807, Aged 36 years.

45. Departed this life 18th Sept., 1832, MARY ANN MYERS, wife of Capt. Nicholas Myers, in the 52nd year of her age. The Wise, the Just, the Virtuous, and the Brave lived in their Deaths and Flourish in the grave: Grain hid in Earth repays the Peasant's care And Evening Sun but set to rise more fair. (Followed by inscription in cipher, with Masonic Emblem.)

46. In Memory of ROBERT MOORE, late Merchant of this City, but formerly of Londonderry, Ireland. The practice of those Republican principles which animated the American Patriots during our glorious Revolution, entailed upon him the enmity of British Tyranny. The strong arm of

oppression forced him in 1798, in the decline of life, on a few hours' notice, after a close confinement of five months and without a trial, from his beloved wife, children and native country. His Country's sufferings and his own misfortunes gradually destroyed a heart always zealous in the cause of Civil and Religious Liberty. He died on the 18th of June, 1807, aged 55 years. Esteemed for every essential quality of a gentleman and a good Citizen. Also of ROBERT SCOTT MOORE, youngest son of Robert, 3d Lieutenant of the Independent Artillery, stationed at Fort McHenry during the bombardment (lower part buried).

X 47. Sacred To the Memory of OLIVIER H. NEILSON, Who died June 21st, 1821, in the 27th year of his age. The grateful affection which attached The Independent Volunteers To their Estimable Commander Erected this Testimony of their Esteem For His Virtues.

48. In memory of JOHN PARKS, who died Sept. 12 1812, in the year of his age. Also his wife, MARGARET PARKS, who died April 1812, In the 70th year of her age.

49. In Memory of GEORGE QUIN, who departed this life October 20th, 1810, aged 50 years.

50. In Memory of THOMAS RAMSEY, who departed this life December 4th. 1817, Aged 36 years and 4 Months.

51. Sacred To the memory of SIR RICHARD LYTTLETON REYNELL, Baronet, and of MARY, his wife, who lie here interred. SIR RICHARD was the fifth Baronet lineally descended from SIR RICHARD REYNELL, Knight and Baronet of East Ogwell, in the County of Devon, Lord Chief Justice of the Kings' Bench in Ireland, in the reign of Charles 2nd, King of England, which SIR RICHARD was descended in a direct line from SIR RICHARD REYNELL, Knight, Keeper of the Castles of Launceston, and Exeter, 1141. SIR RICHARD lived many years in this City and died much respected on

the 4th of September 1829, in the 57th year of his age. Mary, his wife, died on the 29th of April, 1835, In the 57th year of her age. This Monument has been erected by the only surviving Brother of Sir Richard Lyttleton Reynell Major General Sir THOMAS REYNELL, Bart. & K.C.B. of Avisford, in the County of Sussex, England.

52. In Memory of Enoch Richardson, who departed this life December the 18th, 1813, Aged 52 Years and 16 days.

53. Beneath repose the Mortal Remains of WILLIAM ROSS, a Native of Ireland, who departed this life on 1st of July, 1820, in the 60th year of his age. Deeply lamented by all who knew him. This marble, intended to commemorate a name in which every Manly Virtue was centered, is erected as a Tribute of Gratitude and affection by his Relative.

54. In Memory of RICHARD SUMMERWILL, who departed this life May 7th, 1820, Aged 41 years, 4 months and 9 Days. Like as the bud nipt off the tree, So death has parted you and me; When in this yard my grave you see, My dear wife weep not for me. My time has come and blest is he That called me to eternity.

55. In Memory of John Taylor, Formerly of the Parish of Magilligan, County of Derry, Ireland, who departed this Life August 15th 1808, aged 25 years.

56. SARAH TERRY was born July 24th 1801, died in the year of our Lord, 1816, in her 16th year. Sarah Terry was her name, America was my station, Fells Point my dwelling place And Christ is my salvation.

57. Andrew Wark was born September 29th, 1786, died August 11th, 1816. Farewell, my dear and loving wife, Contented may you be, Till you obtain eternal life, Prepare to follow me.

58. Sacred to the memory of JAMES WILSON, who departed

this life June 28th, 1845, in the 61st year of his age. Father, thy will be done; in humble trust We yield the cherished treasure up to thee; Thy word is pledged to raise the precious dust, Adorned with robes of immortality.

59. In Memory of JOHN H. YOUNG (a respectable inhabitant of Fells Point), who died February 14th, 1808, in the 54th year of his age.

X 60. In memory of CAPT. JOHN S. YOUNG, who departed this transitory life September 1st, A.D. 1821, in the 42nd year of his age. He was one of the "noblest works of God".

In 1877 Faith Chapel, a frame building, was erected on the ground, and the Rev. Mr John P. Campbell began the work which he has since carried on. In 1880 the Sunday School had grown to 1,250 members. After the chapel had been several times enlarged the present handsome stone church was erected on the ground and dedicated on Thanksgiving Day, 1884, and the next year the beautiful spire was built by Mr. George S. Brown as a memorial to his mother. In 1896 the Presbyterian Association transferred to Faith Church the Glendy Burial Ground.
