Pilgrimage to Wye

FOR THE

DEDICATION OF THE PACA MONUMENT

SATURDAY, MAY 13, 1911.

The dedication of the Monument recently erected by this Society to Gov. William Paca, one of the four Maryland Signers of the Declaration of Independence, will take place at "Wye," Queen Anne's County, Saturday, May 13th, at 2.30 P. M. The steamer "Clio" has been chartered for the occasion, in order that as many as possible of those interested may attend the exercises.

The number of participants will probably be limited to two hundred and fifty. Members of this Society with their wives and friends, who wish to attend, should register and obtain tickets, not later than April 20th, at the office of the Assistant Cashier of the Fidelity Trust Company, Charles and Lexington Streets. From April 20th to May 10th, the members of other patriotic societies and other persons interested may register.

The price of the tickets will be two dollars for each person, which will include luncheon and supper served by a caterer.

The "Clio" will leave the wharf of the Rock Creek Steamboat Company at the foot of Broadway, (near the terminus of the Madison Avenue car line) punctually at 8 A. M. Upon arrival at Wye Island bridge, the party will proceed to "Wye," a distance of about one mile. If any desire conveyance, and so specify when registering, provision will be made as far as possible, at twenty-five cents for the round trip.

After the dedication ceremonies, which will occupy one hour, the boat will proceed around the island, passing "Wye Hall," Gov. Paca's island home, and other notable Colonial manor-houses, including "Wye Heights," the old Trimble estate, and "Wye House," the seat of Gov. Edward Lloyd, all situated in one of the most attractive farming districts of the Eastern Shore.

It is expected that the boat will return to Baltimore (foot of Broadway) by 10 P. M. Comfortable wraps will probably be required for the return trip. Music will be furnished by Itzel's orchestra and a double quartet ^{from the} ~~of male voices:~~

Goucher College Chapel Choir.

In event of unfavorable weather, the pilgrimage will be postponed, probably to May 20th. In case of uncertainty on account of weather conditions, phone Madison 1399.
