To carry into execution the resolutions of the continental congress, respecting the public defence, it became necessary to raise in the province, the sum of ten thousand pounds, to be laid out in the purchase of arms and ammunition. The convention of Maryland, in assigning to each county the quota that would be requisite from it to make this amount, assigned to Baltimore county, as her proportion, 930 pounds. The Baltimore committee, to whom was entrusted the power of levying this amount on the inhabitants, affixed to the different districts of the country, the sum as follows:
