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1	Has HUD done anything to encourage
2	HABC to use Hollander Ridge HOPE VI funds to
3	provide replacement public housing units outside
4	areas of minority and poverty concentration?
5	Actually, I should revise that
6	question. The question should not be poverty
7	concentration. It should be assisted housing
8	concentration, correct?
9	So let me ask the question that I
10	just said.
11	A. That's more specific.
12	Q. Right. Let me ask it as I should
13	have asked it then.
14	Has HUD done anything to require
15	HABC to use Hollander Ridge HOPE VI funds to
16	provide replacement public housing units outside
17	areas of minority and assisted housing
18	concentration?
19	A. To my knowledge, no.
20	Q. What is the current status of
21	Hollander Ridge HOPE VI grants?

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1	Q. How?
2	A. There are often conferences which we
3	attend on housing issues and they include
4	participants from other housing service providers
5	as well as representatives of the community. And
6	this type of issue is discussed on occasion.
7	Q. And again just to generally orient
8	you, I'm going to ask you just a few questions
9	about Sandtown Winchester.
10	In July of 1993 did HUD approve the
11	location of public housing in Sandtown Winchester?
12	A. In 1993, as I recall, no housing has
13	replacements for public housing that would have
14	been approved in that area.
15	Q. Okay. Has there ever been a time
16	since you returned to HUD in 1987 when HUD approved
17	the location of public housing in Sandtown
18	Winchester?
19	A. Yes, after 1993.
20	Q. When did that occur?
21	A. I can not place it precisely, but I

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- 1 were not resolved, it may again lose its
- 2 eligibility for public housing development funds?
- 3 A. We did not impose that explicit
- 4 sanction, but the same answer I gave on the first
- 5 finding applies for the IG finding.

- 18 Q. Right. And I am now not trying to
- 19 ask this in the specific, but I'm trying to ask
- 20 this in the general. I said did you threaten to
- 21 cut off funding and you said, we didn't use that

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there were other instruments that were being used often and this became an obsolete tool. Now, if there were an HABC tenant who chose to move to Baltimore County, would the 4 5 Baltimore County landlord receive a voucher from 6 HABC or from the Baltimore County authority? 7 What scenario are you referring to? 8 How we operate now or how this program operated? 9 Q. Oh, no, thank you for asking for that clarification. I'm talking about under the 10 regional certificate program, under that program? 11 12 I don't know. 13 Q. Now, during the time of when this 14 program operated, did HABCs's area of operation 15 extend beyond the City? 16 A. In part, yes. 17 0. And what do you mean by, "in part"? 18 It was changed to the Maryland State law, which occurred in 1990. Prior to 1990, the 19 20 law explicitly allowed a Housing Authority to operate up to 10 miles within a surrounding 21

Page 163 jurisdiction if there were no agency operating in that jurisdiction. In the 1990 law, that provision was completely removed. On the other hand, there was a provision which made it clear that housing assistance programs could be operated throughout the state by any administering agency. 7 Q. Now, before 1990 did HABC, in fact, operate outside of the City boundaries? 10 In its Section 8 program, I'm sorry, I don't really know. I believe it may have under 11 the Section 8 program, but I'm not certain of that. 12 Q. Were there any jurisdictions within 13 the 10 miles radius of Baltimore City that did not 14 15 have a PHA other than Baltimore County? I'm not sure how close Howard County 16 is, but they did not for a period. 17 And when did Howard County's public 18 housing program become a PHA? 19 Perhaps the mid '80s or early '80s. 20 A. And was there a time when HABC 21 Q.

Page 185 discusses, "freedom of choice principles"? Yes. Q. Okay. And the sentence appears, "During implementation of this policy, segregation did not appreciably diminish". A. Yes, I see that. 7 Do you agree with that? Q. 8 Not entirely, no. A. Tell me with what part you disagree? 9 I think it was very clear in the 10 A. case of Baltimore City that the willful 11 construction of segregated properties had stopped 12 at this point. And if segregation implies a 13 willful act, I would disagree with the sentence. 14 15 Segregation did not appreciably diminish. 16 Did racial integration appreciably improve during the freedom of choice period? 17 MR. SUBAR: Object as to the form. 18 19 THE WITNESS: No. BY MR. SULLIVAN: 20 If we would turn to the second full 21 Q.
