SANCTIONS AGAINST THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF YUGOSLAVIA (SERBIA AND MONTENEGRO)

A SUMMARY OF EXECUTIVE ORDERS 12808 & 12810

As a result of its involvement in and support for groups attempting to seize territory in Croatia and Bosnia-Hercegovina by force and violence, on May 30, 1992, President Bush declared a national emergency under the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1701 et seq.) and issued Executive Order 12808 freezing the assets of the Governments of Serbia and Montenegro and assets held in the name of the former Government of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia or the recently constituted Federal Republic of Yugoslavia. On June 5, 1992, the President issued Executive Order 12810, expanding the scope of the sanctions program against the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) in view of United Nations Security Council Resolution No. 757. A summary of the sanctions program follows:

(1) Assets blocked: Both Executive Orders block all property and interests in property of the Government of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro), and all property and interests in property in the name of the former Government of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia. "Government of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro)" means the government of the newly-constituted Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, the Government of Serbia, and the Government of Montenegro, including any subdivisions thereof or local governments therein, their respective agencies, instrumentalities and controlled entities, and any persons acting or purporting to act for or on behalf of any of the above. This includes, but not by way of exclusion, the National Bank of Yugoslavia, the Yugoslav National Army, the Yugoslav Chamber of Economy, the National Bank of Serbia, the Serbian Chamber of Economy, the National Bank of Montenegro, and the Montenegrin Chamber of Economy. In addition, all entities located or organized in Serbia or Montenegro, and their foreign subsidiaries, are presumed to be controlled by the Government of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro). U.S. persons, therefore, are prohibited from engaging in transactions with such entities unless licensed by the Office of Foreign Assets Control and all property and property interests within U.S. jurisdiction owned or controlled by such entities are blocked. "U.S. person" means a citizen or permanent resident of, an entity established under the laws of, or an individual or entity located in the United States. "Property" includes all bank accounts, securities, checks, drafts, debts, obligations, and contracts. It also includes all funds transfers for which instructions have been received. Any bank in the U.S. or foreign branch of a U.S. bank with instructions to transfer funds in which there is a Yugoslav, Serbian, or Montenegrin government interest must place the funds into a blocked interest-bearing account on its own books, even where no such account previously existed. Such transfers must be reported to the Compliance Programs Division of the Office of Foreign Assets Control within 10 business days from the value-date of the transfer. Credits to blocked accounts are permissible, but unlicensed debits are prohibited. "This summary of the sanctions program includes a listing of "Blocked Yugoslav Entities Currently Identified" which are owned or deemed to be controlled by the Government of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro). It is not all inclusive. Do not assume that a particular entity is free of such ownership or control, or that it is located outside of Serbia and Montenegro, based solely on its absence from the listing.

Blocked accounts must be interest-bearing, at rates similar to those currently offered other depositors on deposits of comparable size and maturity. Reinvestments may not exceed 90 day maturities. Blocked funds may be moved from one blocked account to another blocked account in the same name within the same domestic financial institution, provided the transfer is reported to the Office of Foreign Assets Control. Banks may debit blocked accounts for normal service charges. All holders of blocked property must register with the Blocked Assets Division of the Office of Foreign Assets Control by July 31, 1992 or within 10 days after such property is received.

(2) Imports prohibited: Imports of goods or services into the United States from the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) are prohibited as well as any dealing in property of Serbian or

Montenegrin or "Yugoslav" origin exported from the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) after May 30, 1992. Any activity which promotes or is intended to promote such transactions is also prohibited.

- (3) Exports prohibited: Exports and reexports to the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro), or to any entity operated from the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro), or owned or controlled by the Government of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro), directly or indirectly, of any goods, technology or services are prohibited. Any activity which promotes or is intended to promote such exports is prohibited. U.S. persons may not deal in property intended for exportation from the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) to any country, or property intended for exportation to the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) from any country. The prohibition on dealing in property being exported to or from the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) does not apply to goods originating outside of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) being transshipped through that country.
- (4) Mail, informational materials, and telecommunications permitted: The receipt or transmission of mail between the United States and the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) is authorized limited to personal communications not involving a transfer of anything of value, and publications and other informational materials, subject to a maximum weight limitation of 12 ounces. The receipt and transmission of telecommunications involving the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Monetenegro) are authorized, provided any payment owed to the Government of the Federal Republic of Of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) or to any other person in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) is paid into a blocked account in a U.S. financial institution.
- (5) Transportation prohibited: Any transaction by a U.S. person, or involving the use of U.S.-registered vessels or aircraft, relating to transportation to or from the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) is prohibited. The provision of transportation to or from the U.S. by any person in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) or any vessel or aircraft registered in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) is also prohibited. The sale in the U.S. of any transportation by air that includes any stop in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) is prohibited. No permission may be granted to any aircraft to take off from, land in, or overfly the U.S., if the aircraft, as part of or as a continuation of that flight, is destined to land in or has taken off from the territory of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro).
- (6) No Yugoslav participation in sporting events or scientific, technical, or cultural exchanges: Any transaction in the U.S. or by a U.S. person related to participation in sporting events in the U.S. by persons or groups representing the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) is prohibited. Any transaction in the U.S. or by a U.S. person related to scientific and technical cooperation and cultural exchanges involving persons or groups officially sponsored by or representing the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro), or related to visits to the U.S. by such persons or groups other than as authorized for the purposes of participation at the United Nations, is prohibited.
- (7) No money to individuals in or to or for the benefit of entities in Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro): Any commitment or transfer, direct or indirect, of funds or other financial or economic resources to or for the benefit of the Government of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro), or any other person in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro), is prohibited. A general license has been issued allowing the transfer of funds or other financial or economic resources for the benefit of individuals in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) in connection with the operation of accounts at U.S. financial institutions that are not blocked, provided that such transactions do not result in a transfer of funds to or for the benefit of the Government of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) or to persons in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro). The performance by any U.S. person, including a bank, of any contract, including a financing contract, in support of an industrial, commercial, public utility, or governmental project in the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (Serbia and Montenegro) is prohibited.

[The Executive Orders do not apply to activities related to the United Nations Protection Force (UNPROFOR), the Conference on Yugoelavia, or the European Community Monitor Mission.}
