*asking President George Bush to recognize the independence of Croatia,

*co-sponsoring S Res-213 which was introduced by Senator Gore and Senator Pell. This resolution calls for immediate recognition of Croatia, Slovenia, and other republics that request recognition.

*co-sponsoring H Con R-224 which was introduced by Congressman Gallegly. This resolution calls for immediate recognition of Croatia and Slovenia.

Honorable Congresswoman Bentley.

I am writing to introduce Mr. Boro Krstulovic, a reporter of the Croatian weekly "Globus".

"Globus" is a Croatian independent political weekly magazine. Its first issue was published a few months after the first free elections in Croatia in the spring of 1990. "Globus" has attracted to its staff the leading Croatian journalists, columnists and independent intellectuals. Due to its independence from the government, objectivity and reliability the magazine quickly gained prominence. In mere seven months this has made it the best selling and the most influential paper in Croatia.

It is important to stress that "Globus" is privately owned and completely independent from the Croatian government. Currently 200.000 copies are being sold every week. This is a very high number for a country of 4.5 million.

Mr. Boro Krstulovic is a young journalist with a degree in art history. Before joining "Globus" he worked as a reporter for Croatian Television. He has been with "Globus" from the first issue and has specialized in political interviews. He is also a photographer.

The purpose of Mr. Krstulovic's trip to the USA is to conduct a series of interviews with prominent politicians and public figures whose opinion on the crisis caused by the breakup of Yugoslavia will interest the readers of "Globus". We in the Croatian American Society hope you will find time to meet him.
