B.U. Takes Small College Soccer Crown

24 Shots Saved By Bates Barger, Thompson Score

B.U.'s Varsity Soccer team regained the epitomy of small college pitch Saturday by defeating Elizabethtown College 2-1 in the N.C.A.A. finals at West Chester State College in Pennsylvania.

Little Tommie Thompson netted the first Bee goal in the first quarter and was awarded an assist on the final counter of the game. The diminutive outside right played an outstanding game and redeemed himself for being offside during the M-D championship Lynchburg Gil.

The victory was the sum result of Coach Reece Livingston's superlative coaching. Coach Livingston, an All-American goalie at Towson State, tutored goalie Charlie Bates. The result was shown in the fourth quarter of the game Saturday.

Elizabethtown smashed a shot toward the right of goalie Bates. The magnificent B.U. goal tender flung his body against the post

the game may well have been lost as there remained only an approximate three minutes left in the tilt. In all, the B.U. goalie, Charlie Bates, turned 24 shots aside while holding the potent Elizabethtown line to a scant and lonesome 1 goal.

The defense sparkled once again, but the offensive line gave the University of Baltimore their second National championship in the last three years. And, it was Coach Reece Livingston's imaginative foresight, or outstanding strategy which produced the opportunity for the game winning counter.

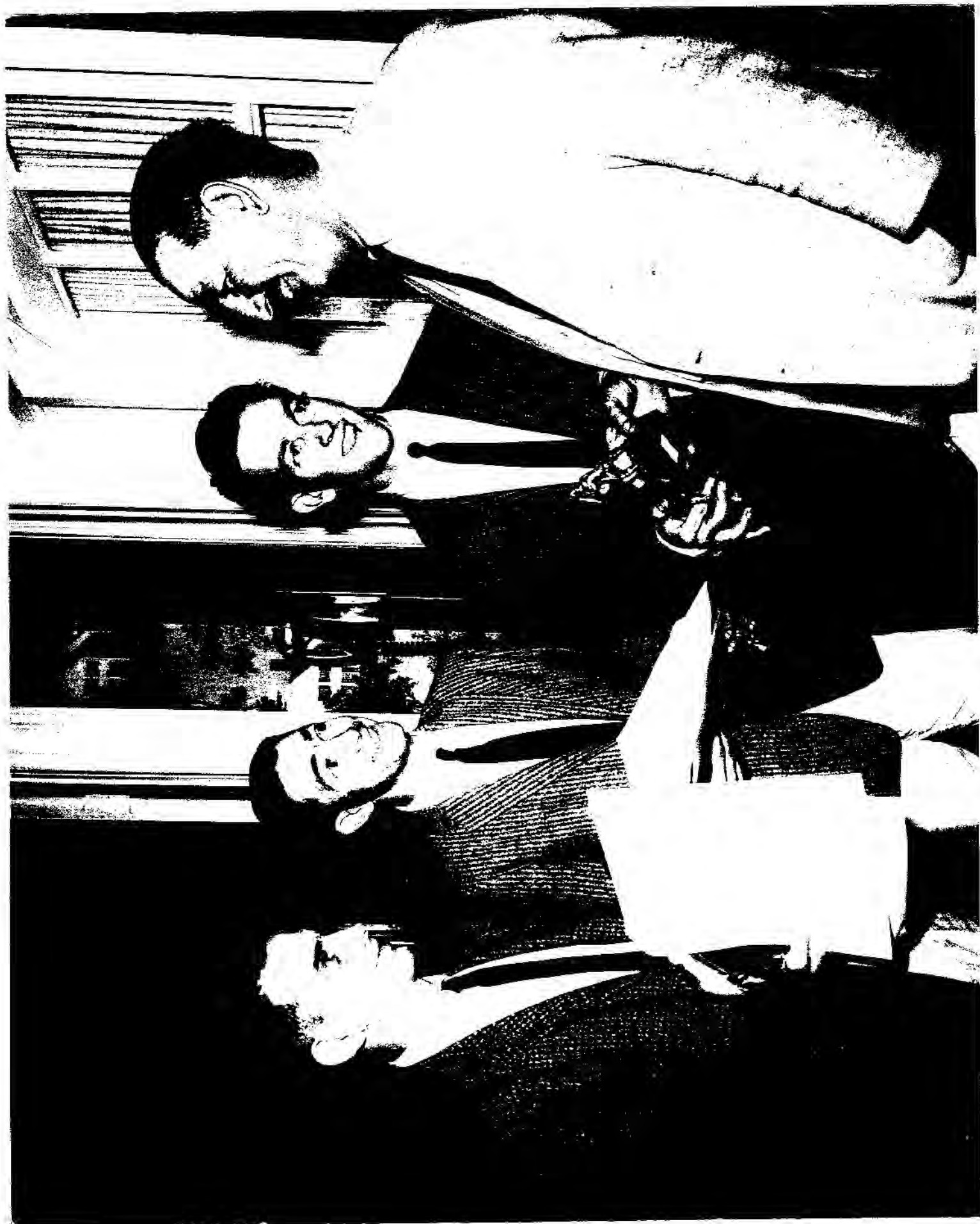
