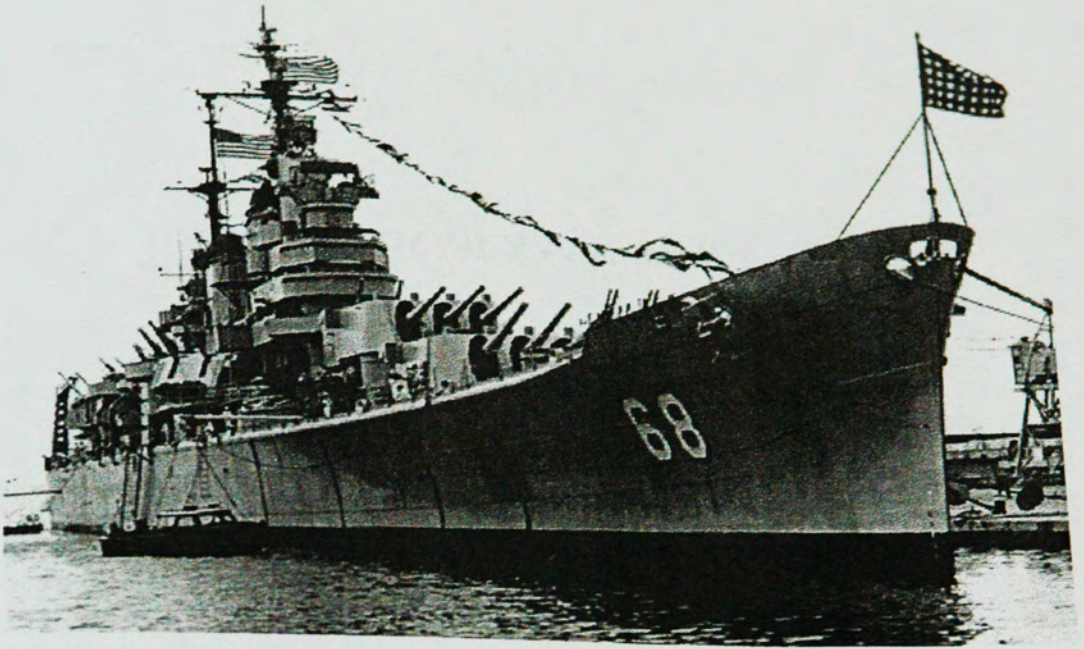

SEVENTH FLEET ACTIVITY

On January 16, 1955 proceeded via Guantanamo Bay, Cuba
and The Panama Canal to Pearl Harbor
Joined the U.S. Pacific Fleet / SEVENTH FLEET
in Yokosuka, Japan on March 4, 1955
Proceeded to Sochen Ri, Korea to provide Naval Presence
Showed the flag from March to August 1955
visiting Seoul, Nagasaki, and Kobe, Japan; Manila, The Philippines
Hong Kong, and Kaohsiung, Taiwan
Returned to new Homeport Long Beach, California on August 22, 1955
Received armament and engineering upgrades at
Mare Island Naval Shipyard in 1955
Then finally to Seattle (Bremerton), Washington
for Inactivation on May 31, 1956

Struck from The U.S. Navy Ship's List on February 15, 1971
Scrapped in Portland, Oregon and her armor belt plate
sent to Fermi National Laboratory, Batavia, Illinois
